Our Goal:

Total cleaning time recommended: 1 hour-1 1/2 hours

- Try to split up in shifts due to covid gathering restrictions
 - Have a school wide project or invite other organizations to participate in the project

• TIME FRAME:

- o March 1, 2022 March 31, 2022
- To make it easier for clubs across the state the project will not have a set date that it has to be done on so instead clubs will choose a day that works with them and plan When, where, and how they will complete the project.

• INSTRUCTIONS:

- Clubs will choose a day within the time frame and plan the cleanup project that better fits their needs. So it will be up to the clubs to decide where/what they want to clean up whether that be a beach clean-up, street, neighborhood, etc.
- o There are two options for this project:
 - OPTION 1: The club will plan an in-person project for there members to attend together
 - Ex. The club will pick a date within the time frame and they plan to do a clean-up.
 - To plan the club will need to make sure they have permission forms

- Times for when they want to clean up
- Have shifts if they want to
- Make Sure they take a photo to verify they actually completed the project
- OPTION 2: The club will plan an asynchronous project meaning you announce a project but leos do it within a certain time frame that you provide
 - Ex. The club announces the trash pick up the project for around their neighborhood
 - You will give the leos about a week to complete the project on their own time
 - Timing is up to you
 - Leos will send in a photo verification so you know they actually participated in the project
 - You will also need to add a disclaimer to your project permissions forms as there is no advisor or supervisor watching the leos since it will be on their own time
- Ways to verify your participation and completion of the project:
 - The trash verification/submission will send out on a google form
 - Instructions to verify completion:
 - Take a group/selfie picture with filled up trash bags
 - Provide signature by parent/guardian on the permission form for the event
 - Clubs will be in charge of making their permission forms
